

- Examinations shall be governed by common regulations for Masters' degrees in the University of Nairobi and regulations in the faculty of Veterinary Medicine.
- All candidates shall be required to take written examinations in the nine courses as specified below.

JPH 600: Veterinary Public Health Administration and Practice	1 x 2 hrs
JPH 601: Food hygiene and quality control	1 x 3 hrs
JPT 602: Food and Environmental Toxicology	1 x 2 hrs
JPH 603: Biostatistics and computer use	1 x 3 hrs
JPH 604: Zoonoses	1 x 3 hrs
JPH 605: Epidemiology	1 x 3 hrs
JPT 605: Principles of scientific communication	1 x 2 hrs
JPH 615: Applied Immunology and Molecular Biology	1 x 3 hrs
JPH 612: Planning, Monitoring and Evaluation of Animal Health Projects	1x3 hrs

- All the courses taken in a given semester shall be examined at the end of that semester
- Each course shall be graded independently out of 100%
- The final examination shall constitute 70% of the marks for each course while continuous assessment shall constitute the remaining 30%.
- Continuous assessment shall be by written tests, practical and assignments.
- The pass mark in each course shall be 50%.
- A candidate may be allowed to sit a supplementary examination in the failed course(s) within 3 months.
- A candidate who fails in a supplementary examination will be allowed to retake the same course once.
- A candidate must pass all the courses before embarking on the research and thesis.
- A candidate who fails in the re-take in any one course, or fails to take any prescribed course(s) without good cause will be discontinued.
