He got his PhD in Veterinary Epidemiology, Masters of Science in Veterinary Epidemiology and Economics and a Bachelor of Veterinary Medicine (BVM) from the University of Nairobi. He has been extensively involved in wildlife veterinary practice mostly in areas of clinical interventions, translocations and disease surveillance, investigations and monitoring. He has also been involved in research work mostly in epidemiology of diseases such as *Sarcoptic* mange, Bovine Tuberculosis, Rinderpest and Rift Valley Fever. He has published extensively in area of wildlife health and has presented many papers on wildlife health in various international forums.
